

Marshall County List of Resources

Christian Community Outreach assists a limited area of Marshall County. They may be able to help with paying light bills, rent, water bills, and sometimes prescription medications. The amount of financial aid paid out by the charity is limited, and is often up to \$50. Also, in addition to help with those expenses, on the 1st Thursday and Saturday of the month they have food boxes and groceries available at the CCO Building at New Harmony. Call (256) 659-6802, or find assistance from Christian Community Outreach.

Community Action Agency of Northeast Alabama, Inc. also serves Marshall County. Some of the assistance programs they offer include clothing, the Neighbor - helping-neighbor energy bill assistance program, and government grants for expenses such as rent or a security deposit. Referrals may be given by the non-profit to an Emergency food pantry, warm clothing or food boxes.

Low income families may be eligible for the **DOE weatherization program** for their homes. A focus is on keeping the elderly and children warm, so additional support includes loans to help with the emergency buying of home fuel (LIHEAP) and blankets. Call (256) 571-7723. Salvation Army of Marshall County - This non-profit may be able to provide assistance once a year in extreme emergencies for utility and cooling bills, rent and prescriptions. Additional seasonal type assistance programs are offered too. These can include free Christmas assistance, gifts for children, free back to school supplies, and meals. The main center is in Guntersville Alabama, but services are administered for the entire county. If the Salvation Army can't meet your needs, they will offer referrals and other support to the needy and low income. Quality of Life Health Services ((256) 593-2371) may be able to offer health care on a sliding fee scale. Access Primary care, dental assistance, Immunizations, Pharmacy, and other medical programs. The low income and uninsured may receive help too.

Marshall County Christian Services - They run a food pantry and thrift store. Some of what may be offered includes clothing, school supplies, and gently used furniture. The food pantry may have free boxes of groceries for Marshall County families. (256) 878-3177

Managing Agency [U.S. Department of Health and Human Services](#) In order to qualify for this benefit program, you must be a resident of Alabama, responsible for a child under 18 years of age, unless in school. If in school, the child may receive benefits through the month before their 19th birthday. You must also be a U.S. citizen, legal or qualified alien, have low or very low income, and be either under-employed (working for very low wages), unemployed or about to become unemployed. The family cannot have net monthly income that equals or is more than the payment standard and must be eligible for at least \$10.
